

The Nescafe Nymph

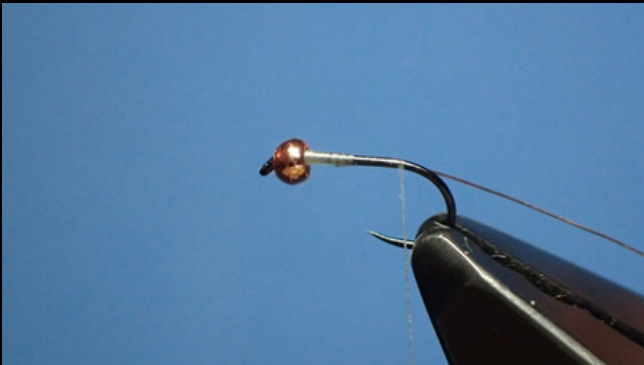
Step by Step Guide

Materials Required

- Hook: Size 18 - 22
- Bead: 2mm - 1.5mm Tungsten
- Thread: Uni 17/0 Trico
- Rib: Copper wire; fine
- Tail: Coq de Leon
- Body: Nescafe rabbit
- Back: Pheasant tail fibres
- Collar: Brown squirrel

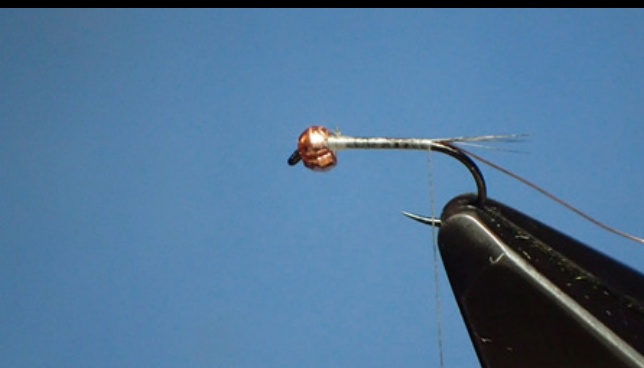
Tying Notes

This is a pattern used in Bosnia on the Ribnik & Pliva which was designed by local guide, Jan Jankovic. The body colour was described as the colour of foam on espresso coffee, mixed with a pinch of white rabbit.



Step One:

Thread bead on hook. Fix hook in vice and catch on thread. Catch in rib on the way down and stop at the bend of the hook.



Step Two:

Catch in tail on top of the hook shank. The tail length should be the length of the hook shank.



Step Three:

Catch in 4 to 5 pheasant tail fibres on top of the hook shank.



Step Four:

Dub on dubbing and wrap towards the bead.



Step Five:

Pull pheasant tail towards the bead to form the back and secure.



Step Six:

Cut away waste and rib with 4 to 5 open turns keeping the pheasant tail on top. Secure rib and remove waste.



Step Seven:

Dub on a pinch of dark brown squirrel and whip finish.
